Choice Activity #1: Graphing Letters

Create a chart of the number of letters in your classmates' first names. Then create a bar graph to show the data.

(Example: If four students' names have 7 letters, your bar graph would need to represent this)

Choice Activity #2: Create Your Own Graph

Create your own graph (any type you want!). Then write 3-5 questions about your graph for others to answer. Provide an answer key.

Choice Activity #3: Survey Time!

- 1. Make a survey where you can gather data about others (such as: Which color do you like most? Or what is your favorite subject in school?).
- 2. Then find a way to gather this data. Will you ask them in-person? Will you post your survey on a wall or board for people to mark? Will you create an online survey and send it to your class (with your teacher's permission)?
- 3. Give others time to answer your survey question.
- 4. Once the survey is complete, choose a graph that best represents your data and create the graph.
- 5. Then share it with your teacher and class!
